#### **Purple Friday!**

Since 2004, LGBT History Month is celebrated every February in the UK. It is an opportunity to connect and reflect on the past and present of the LGBT community, celebrate LGBT culture and explore what the lessons of history can teach us for the future. Like all high schools across the country, Dalkeith High School has its own LGBTQ+ community, made up of teachers and pupils. # Head Teacher's Update

Dear Parent/Carer,

Well, we have come to the end of term, and what a great term it has been.

Since I last wrote to you all, I attended the Youth Philanthropist Initiative final with our S2 year group. It was brilliant to see how confident our young people were while presenting their charities to their year group. Congratulations to all the finalists but especially the winning group, which included, Freddie Campbell, Edie Green and Alex Kerr. Their success on the day resulted in them winning £3000 for their charity MYPAS, a mental health charity.

We have also had a number of Drama performances over the past two weeks. A huge well done to all the pupils and staff involved in arranging these evenings. We appreciate everyone who attended, to show support to our talented young people.

At the weekend, I had the absolute pleasure of attending the National Portrait Gallery to see the exhibition opening "Before and After Coal". Our S3 pupils were involved in this project and the work they produced is hanging on the walls amongst some the most famous portraits in Scotland. The exhibition is free of charge and runs until September. I would encourage you all to take some time to visit the gallery to see the brilliant and thought provoking work our young people created.

Over the past two weeks, we appointed a new Drama Teacher, Ms Dunion. Pending pre-employment checks Ms Dunion will join our team permanently from August 2024. The long leet interviews for the Acting Head Teacher post took place last Friday. The short leet interviews will take place on 28th March 2024. Since November, S2 pupils have been taking part in the Youth and Philanthropy Initiative (YPI). 

## Wing and a Prayer Hen Rescue!

Over the weekend DHS welcomed a flock of eight chickens to join our bees in the grounds of the apiary garden. This was a project entirely conceived by a small group of pupils who (against his better judgment!) convinced Mr McGlade to add to our smallholding so that pupils can work towards a SQA level 4 qualification in animal care. The group did all the research that would be required for their care, costed out and selected the equipment and built their coop, run and made sure the garden was as safe an environment as we can make it. The hens came from "Wing and a Prayer Hen Rescue" who collect hens who are past their prime laying years from farms and save them from slaughter. Ours are about two years old and came from a free range farm in Midlothian and so we will be replicating the good conditions they are used to as they will have the whole garden to range over during the day and will be looked after by young people who really care about them. Many thanks to all who have been involved in making the project happen.




# Science Centre Visit DHS!

# 'Before and After Coal' Community Engagement Project

You may recall in a previous bulletin that Mrs Zielinksi shared information about her S3 Art and Design class being involved in a Community Art Project. Eight weeks of practical workshops led by a practising artist and staff from the National Galleries Scotland, explored current cultural trends and influences, including the impacts within their local community past and present. We are delighted to share with you all that the work by pupils is now featured in an exhibition within a prestigious Art Gallery in Edinburgh.

The work by Shireen Ahmad, Cal Archibald, Kiera Brown, Millie Chalmers, Scott Crew, Holly Gilmour, Taylor Mackenzie, Eva MacMillan, Christopher Martin, Megan Maxton, Jay Melrose, Hallie Mortimer, Victor Pazos Neira, Hossam Shalah and Millie Stewart can be seen in the Scottish National Portrait Gallery, Edinburgh. The work is part of the wider exhibition 'Before and After Coal' which includes banners, photographs, clothing and video interviews. Together the work tells a story of de-industrialisation and change following the aftermath of the mining strikes in 1984. To mark the fortieth anniversary of such strikes and the impacts felt across Scottish communities, school students and community groups have reflected upon the values of former mining communities and the young people who live there today.

The large scale banners on display by pupils from Dalkeith High School and Beath High School express their views and feelings towards the world they live in. This work, alongside the historical photographs and accounts from former miners, showcase a narrative about the gap between the young people and their mining forebears.

Mrs Zielinski attended the official Exhibition opening event on Saturday 23rd March. The celebration started with a parade of banners circulating St Andrews Square, led by former miners and their families, before returning to the Portrait Gallery. Priority access to explore the exhibition and the opportunity to meet other people involved in the wide scale project allowed attendees to engage with the immensity and diversity of the project which has been ongoing since 2021. Speeches followed by a minute's silence to respect all those impacted in the strikes forty years ago was a heartfelt and fitting tribute.

Mrs Zielinski thoroughly enjoyed being part of this opening celebration and is looking forward to taking her pupils to explore it in the coming weeks. She would highly encourage everyone to make a visit to the Portrait Gallery to see the work by S3 pupils but also the wider exhibition that highlights the hardship, resilience and spirit of survival amongst mining communities.

"The eight week project which my S3 pupils have been involved in has offered them freedom to explore their creativity, views and opinions in a safe and respected environment. Seeing their artwork on display in the Portrait Gallery was a very emotional moment for me as I am so proud of what they have achieved. They have fully immersed themselves into this creative project with maturity, respect and consideration for each other and the local mining communities, resulting in outstanding outcomes being created."

'Before and After Coal' runs from 24th March until 15th September 2024 at the National Portrait Gallery, Queen Street, Edinburgh. Admission is free and the gallery is open daily from 10am - 5pm.

#### 'Fashion Crisis' by Dalkeith, Newbattle and Beath High School pupils




