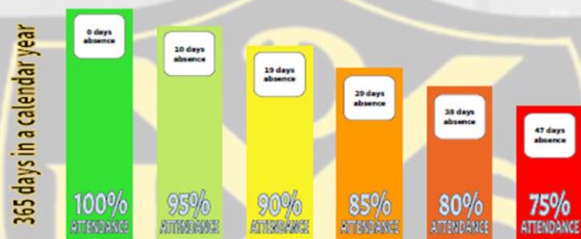

- Black trainers (white sole/stripe acceptable) / Black shoes / Black boots

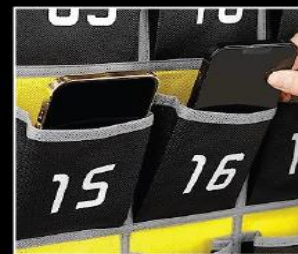
No:

Mobile Phone Policy



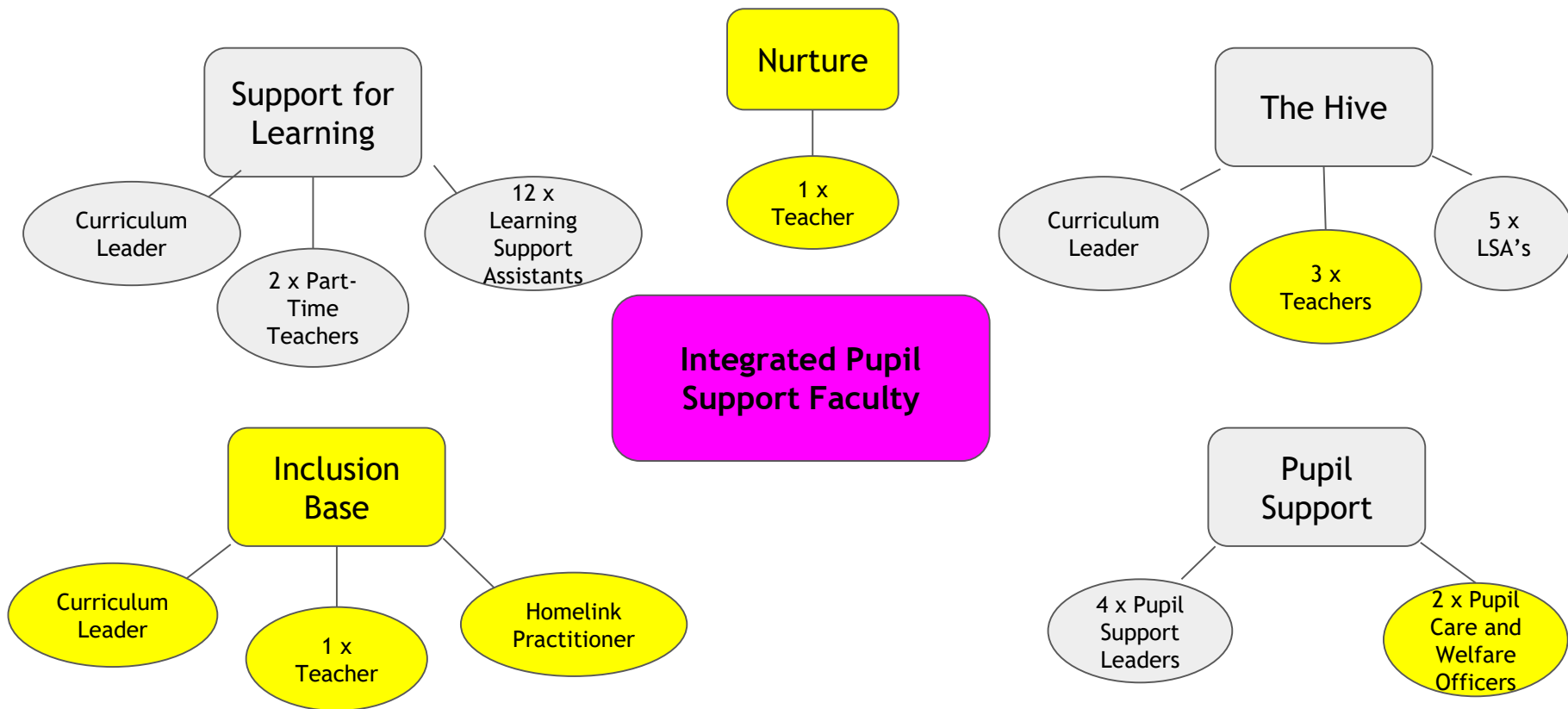
On entering the classroom you must place your phone in the pocket that matches your desk number.
